### **New Hybrid Program**

The Maine Children's Scholarship Fund is now offering a hybrid scholarship. The hybrid scholarship is for students not in traditional public/private school or homeschool. The hybrid scholarship helps with the cost of tuition only for students that are accepted to online academy's. MCSF will cover 65% of tuition up to \$900. # What is Maine Children's Scholarshp Fund?

The Maine Children's Scholarship Fund (MCSF) provides scholarships to Maine children in grades K-12 to help pay for part of public, private or home-school and online academy expenses. MCSF provides 75 percent of tuition per child up to \$1400 and the families contribute at least 25 percent. MCSF reimburses home-schooling cost up to \$500 per child and reimburse 65% up to \$900 for online academy. Scholarships are awarded to all school aged children in a family. To qualify, family income must be at or below the Federal Free and Reduced Lunch Program
